There are several ways of talking about the future in English. Rather than trying to learn the rules, just memorise some key examples, like the ones below.

Present simple

for timetables and schedules
 Leave on the 21st.

will

- for giving information about the future *It'll be summer.*
- for predicting what we think or guess will happen We'll have a great time!

going to

- for plans and intentions We're going to get one tomorrow.
- for predictions based on what you know or what you can see What's the weather going to be like? (Look at those clouds. It's going to rain.)

Present continuous

• for fixed arrangements I'm coming to see you in May.
