

Adverbs are used to describe how we do things. Adverbs in the comparative and superlative are formed by adding more and most.


Positive Comparative Superlative


She sings beautifully.


She sings more beautifully than her sister.

Superlative Superlative

She sang most beautifully at the Christmas concert.







Use of English: Comparatives and superlatives of adverbs

We normally use more and most to make comparative and superlative adverbs.

You can run the 400 metres more quickly than I can run the 200 metres.

The most quickly I've run 100 metres is 12.9 seconds. It's my personal best.

Some comparatives and superlatives of adverbs end in -er and -est:

adverb	comparative	superlative	
fast	faster	fastest	
long	longer	longest	
high	higher	highest	


The following comparative and superlative adverbs are irregular:

adverb	comparative	superlative
well	better	(the) best
badly	worse	(the) worst
far	further	(the) furthest
much	more	(the) most
